As Historians we will begin by finding out about different early explorers to the poles. We will investigate what life was like on these expeditions before becoming modern day explorers and comparing the experience of explorers now to back in Scott and Shakleton's day.

As Artists we will be looking at the use of colour, tone and texture in pictures. We will analyse other artist's work before painting a wintery scene using the skills we have learned.

As Language Speakers we will continue to learn Spanish and add to our developing vocabulary.

As Mathematicians we will explore repeated addition and arrays to multiply. We will then move on to time and perimeter. Finally, we will look at fractions and link this to division where we need to share equally.

During swimming we will be improving our technique to increase the distance we can swim.

In Gymnastics we will focus on using different sequences of travel and balances.


Poles Apart

As Scientists we will be finding out about the human skeleton and identifying other animals with skeletons. We will also look at how much nutrition our bodies need compared to polar explorers.
