

We have had another busy week and spent a good deal of our time using the outdoor areas watching the leaves on the trees change colour a sign of Autumn. We have been busy in the allotment weeding and digging preparing the soil for new plants. We have also been looking at the flowers and how they have changed into seed pods, which we have collected ready for next year. At Forest School we have been learning the rules and boundaries while sitting together in base camp. We have been exploring the area to find the best hiding places for when we play "1,2,3 Where are you"? We have taken risks climbing fallen trees and swinging from branches.

Reminder All children need to bring a named coat to playgroup and wear layers as the weather is getting colder now.


This week's song:


