What have we been learning?

<u>English</u>

Over the past two weeks, we have been looking at narrative stories. We have read 'The Great Kapok Tree' and identified its SPaG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) features. This week, we innovated the text and have enjoyed using our imaginations to develop our own rainforest stories based on the original text.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths, we looked at converting KM to M. We looked at perimeter and we focused on multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. We have used place value grids and counters to support our understanding.

<u>Quest</u>

In RE, we have been learning about Hinduism and how Hindus pray to their many Gods. We set up our own pretend Hindu shrine whilst learning about the puja (the Hindu form of worship!). In Science, we have been looking at 'Living Things'. We have learnt about the five main classification groups, created our own dichotomous keys and looked out how habitats can change. We even had a look in the forest school area to identify some local insect habitats! We started looking at colours in Spanish and played games to help us to remember the colours. We also had a fantastic team of archery professionals come and teach us how to play!
