

If your child will be absent from school due to illness, please telephone the school office, before 9am, stating child's name, class and the nature of the illness.




#### **Medical Appointments**

# **School Lunches**

The cost of a school lunch is £2.34. We prefer you to pay using ParentPay if possible. Please contact the school office if you need log in details.

Children in Reception, Year 1 & 2 are entitled to universal free school meals & do not need to pay.

Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 need to pay for school meals unless entitled to Free School Meals.

#### Children dropped off / collected late

As you know we take the safety and care of our pupils very seriously. Thank you to those of you who let us know if you are running a little late - for the vast majority of people this is a very rare occurrence. When they are late we expect children to be signed in /out and a reason given for the lateness.

Any Parent or carer who becomes more frequently late in dropping off / picking up their child will receive a letter inviting them to a meeting to explain the reason for such events.

Where being late collecting children becomes even more frequent our Attendance Policy states that where "Parents or Carers are not consistently fetching their children on time or do not keep us fully informed as to why they are late then we may charge a fee for after school care". This would be an extreme measure but ensures that staff are not put in situations where they become "child carers" beyond their paid roles. ### **Morning Routines**

It is so lovely to see everyone back on site and the way in which you are all coming in. However, please be aware that school and playgroup are being very prompt with shutting doors as it is important to begin the day calmly.

# Therefore we remind you that school doors shut at 8.55am and playgroup at 9am.

So we can keep the school site safe we will begin shutting the gates which are nearest to Year 5 and 6 (Tuffley Avenue and of Calton Road), including the Ribston gates, at 8.56am and so to avoid being unable to leave the site if you are running a little late it will be better to leave at the gate via the Reception Classes.

This gate will also be locked at as near to 9.01am as possible.

The best option for you all is to aim to be here well before the time we lock up!

## Remote Learning and Covid 19

Here at Calton Primary School we take our legal obligations very seriously and this is no more so when it comes to children being given every opportunity to learn and grow.

As the rules have changed for isolation we are hoping we will not have many children off school. However, should a child test positive for Covid 19 following a PCR test, we will contact you. On offer will be remote learning via eSchools, touching base from a member of staff (usually the Class Teacher) and access to a laptop if necessary.

If your child also qualifies for free school meals there will also be the option of a packed lunch to fetch.

However, we equally recognise that if a child has Covid 19 they may of course be unwell in which case we would not expect them to be carrying out work—they need to get better!
