In Maths we have completed our unit on addition and subtraction skills. We continued to add and subtract 3 digit numbers using exchanging and carrying. We have just started our new unit on multiplication which has seen us describe equal groups and calculate their total amounts.

In English, we have started our non-chronological reports about events in Gloucester. We started by reading a report about Pakistan and using it to identify the features. We have then story mapped the text and researched our own events that have happened in Gloucester. After that, we used our new facts to plan our non-chronological report about Gloucester and have written the introduction and first paragraph.

Science has seen us begin our learning about our new unit Animals and Humans. We started by looking at the different nutrients humans need to keep themselves healthy.
