



Coronavirus Contingency Plan 17th March 2020

We would like to start by thanking you all for your support and calm manner during this challenging time. Please be assured that we continue to take national advice and guidance regarding the safety and welfare of our school community.

Please can we ask that you do not send your child(ren) to school if they have a high temperature or a new, continuous cough. Further up to date guidance is available on the NHS website: <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/>

If one person from a household starts to display a high temperature or a persistent cough – **everyone living in the household must stay at home for 14 days.** All staff will take the same precautions.

Staff will continue to monitor childrens' symptoms and whilst we are not health professionals we are aware the onset of the virus can happen very quickly. We will need to contact you to collect your child(ren) if we suspect signs of the virus. We understand this is not ideal however we hope that you fully appreciate our reasoning behind this.

Please can we urge that the school office has the most up to date contact details for your family. If you are unsure whether this is the case, please telephone the school office on 01452 527689 to check. In the event of closure, the school will continue to send text messages.

We will continue to monitor on a daily basis the staff to pupil ratio in our school. Please be prepared that without the adequate ratio the school will have to close. At the moment mass school closures are not set to be deployed, although the government has said they remain an option.

In the event that school does close or your child(ren) are unable to be in school, the following measures are in place:

1. Each child will be given a small pack of work/activities.
2. Work and activities will be uploaded onto Eschools including:
 - Spellings
 - Reading activities

- Writing opportunities
- Using Doodlemaths and Doodletables
- Accessing GoNoodle (an exercise website)
- We have also included a list of general websites that you can access with your child(ren) at the end of this letter.
- We will update with new websites and/or resources as the need arises.

If you choose to use YouTube, we advise that you are careful due to pop-ups which are beyond our control.

Please ensure you have access to **Eschools** as this will be the main communication point for all teaching materials. Your child(ren) has been issued log-ins for **DoodleMaths** in the past. If you require support accessing these, please call the school office on 01452 527689.
