

Year 2 continue to enjoy learning about the Great Fire of London. They had a fantastic becoming bakers, like Thomas Farriner, and learning how to make their own bread rolls in DT this week. The children used this experience to write their own instructions in English using the correct structure, features and terminology.



In computing the children started their own research project and came up with questions they would like to research over the next few weeks using a search engine. They also learnt about how to turn on a laptop and how to log in using a username and a password. In History the children have at multiple sources that were used to discover what happened during this significant event and used this to retell the main events.

In Science the children enjoyed going on a materials walk around the school where they identified different materials and their uses. In PSHE we talked about worries that we might have and who we can talk to if we are worried about something. We have been busy practising our throwing and catching skills in PE and have applied this to play small team games.

In Maths the children have continued to focus on place value. They learnt how to compare and order 2-digit numbers and practised counting in multiples of 2, 3, 5 and 10. The children are now focusing on addition and subtraction. They have learnt about fact families and how to find the inverse to check our calculations

Coming up...

The children will continue to learn about the Great Fire of London and the famous figures from this time period in History. They will interview Samuel Pepys to learn about his role in the Great Fire of London and use the information they collect to create their own fact files.

In Maths the children will continue to focus on addition and subtraction. They will use their knowledge of tens and ones to identify number bonds to 100, to add and subtract ones and to add and subtract tens from different numbers.
