Over the last two weeks, Year 6 have been engaging in lots of activities inside and outside of the classroom.



In Maths we have continued with our subject of fractions, securing and building on the knowledge we have already learnt. In recent days we have focused on using the four operations (add, subtract, multiply and divide) with fractions. Furthermore, we have looked at the process of converting mixed fractions to improper and vice versa before finally looking at how to find fractions of amounts.
